# Lock Keeper's Cottage gets a seasonal make-over

The Lock Keeper's Cottage once again has had a seasonal make-over and the Heritage Guides can welcome visitors with a wonderful display of Easter eggs, bunnies, hot cross buns and a basket of chicks. Thank you to our volunteers who produced the Easter display for all our visitors to enjoy.

This year our volunteers opened the cottage and barge on St. Patrick's Day and around 90 visitors took the opportunity to call in and chat to the Heritage Guides and learn a little of the local history.

In April we are hoping to get a supply of herbaceous plants for the cottage garden. We would be grateful for help from any of you who are gardeners to transfer a rather boring patch into an array of colour.

# **Volunteer Wildlife Surveyors**

Our Wildlife Surveyors are about to get busy as this is the time of year when most of our wildlife surveys kick off. Butterflies, bees, bats and wildfowl are all about to be counted with the data going to CEDaR. CEDaR is the centre for environmental data and recording and its core aims and objectives are to collate the biodiversity data needed to implement the Northern Ireland Biodiversity Strategy. Recording biodiversity can help monitor species over time, measure impacts of change and is crucial for forming legislation.

# Weekend opening

We are continuing to open the cottage and the barge to visitors on the last weekend of the month. This has proved popular with visitors to the site with over 250 people visiting on the first weekend opening of the year.

# **Updates on Conservation Tasks**

Despite a few wet Saturdays we managed to carry out a lot of conservation work throughout the winter months. Winter is a good time of year to cut back scrub when there is no nest building taking place.

We kicked off the New Year in 2017 with a session of woodland management in McIlroy Park where a lot of undergrowth was cleared from a woodland area and coppicing of hazel trees was carried out.

Following a hedge-laying, one-day course in November 2016, in Lagan Meadows, a further session was planned for late January, Most volunteers taking part received a second level hedge-laying accreditation. If you are taking a walk in Lagan Meadows don't forget to check out the newly laid hedge and look for new growth and the hedge returning to life. Hedges are mainly installed as stock-proof field boundaries but they also create a wonderful wildlife corridor and a source of food and shelter for birds, small mammals and invertebrates.

Early February saw some planting of tree whips by our volunteers at the edge Belvoir Park Forest. A task involving meadow management, followed on the 18<sup>th</sup> February when scrub was cleared from land at the end of Sharman Drive to make way for planting of a wildflower meadow later in the year.

On the 4<sup>th</sup> March Conservation Volunteers returned to clear scrub and continue with the coppicing of hazel, in McIlroy Park, opening up the woodland area and the final task in March saw the volunteers planting whips in empty spaces along the hedgerow bordering the towpath.

#### Wildlife

In April listen out for the calls of swifts as they circle overhead on their return from Africa. Swifts live on the wing only landing to breed and rear their young.





Another bird to watch out for is our new arrival, the great spotted woodpecker. One of our volunteers was able to get a snap of one of these birds in Belvoir Park Forest.

We recently heard that there are signs of red squirrel in Hydebank woods. It is encouraging to know that our little native friend is surviving not too far away.

The Lagan Valley Regional Park Five Year Management Plan is now in final draft form and will be finalised in the near future.
