## **Update on Conservation Tasks**



The team were busy in the first two months of 2018, continuing with the vegetation removal from the Giant's Ring boundary wall for the first task of the new year: carrying out hazel coppicing and scrub clearance in the young woodland at McIlroy Park over two very productive sessions in January and February, and then tackling a large stand of non-native invasive Cherry Laurel in Derriaghy Glen for the second February task.

Unfortunately heavy snow and public holidays meant that there were no tasks in March – though it wasn't for lack of enthusiasm as many of the volunteers were keen to brave the snow, had the work been feasible in the conditions. Thanks are due for your undaunted dedication.

#### Wildlife Surveys

As part of the **All-Ireland Pollinator Plan**, Wildlife Survey Volunteers will be undertaking bumblebee surveys as part of the **Bumblebee Monitoring Scheme** this year on six transects across the Regional Park once a month from March until October.

A training and education session at the end of February by Aoibhinn Corrigan from NIEA was attended by eleven volunteers - some keen to simply learn more about these fascinating and important pollinators and seven of whom will carry forward the transect surveys. Hopefully the spring will bring some well-needed warmth for the emerging bees after the recent cold weather.



April also heralds the start of **UKBMS Butterfly Monitoring Scheme** season. If anyone is keen to get involved with butterfly surveying, please contact Dan at the Office. We would be very keen to find a dedicated volunteer/s who could carry on a long-established UKBMS transect at Shaw's Bridge left vacant this year by the sad passing of Eleanor Anderson.

It would be a fitting tribute if someone could continue this work. Please do be aware that butterfly transect volunteering does require time commitment as <u>surveys are carried out weekly from April until the end of September</u> and are weather dependent.



## **Eleanor Anderson (1943 – 2018)**

It was with great sadness that we heard of the passing of Eleanor Anderson on 19 February.

Eleanor had been involved with the Regional Park since the beginning of the volunteering programme, and gave so much of her time and her passion for wildlife and the outdoors to her many volunteering roles here. She volunteered on conservation tasks, surveyed squirrels and butterflies, supported events and loved to photograph the flowers and beauty of Lagan Valley.
