Lock Keeper's Cottage and Heritage Guide Update



Having more of the LVRP volunteer team back on site, particularly with the re-opening of the Lock Keeper's Cottage, has certainly been one of the highlights of the year for us, and for the many visitors who have crossed the cottage threshold since the doors re-opened in mid-May.

Up to December, a total of **3,916 visitors** have been welcomed to the Cottage by LVRP Heritage Guide volunteers during the **440.5 hours** of opening that they have facilitated since re-opening.

A huge thank you to our small team of Cottage guides for enabling our local communities, and visitors from much further afield, to engage with the local history of the Lagan, and enjoy a friendly chat by the fire.

A big thank you also to our **Barge Heritage Guides**, who remain steadfastly committed to returning to welcoming visitors to the Industry Barge, when it is possible to do so.

Update on Conservation Tasks: Nov – Dec

Great work all round folks!

In the final months of 2022, as throughout the year on alternate Saturdays and Thursdays, our teams of LVRP Conservation Volunteers have been busy carrying out habitat management tasks at several sites across the Regional Park:

- 2 grassland management tasks, in partnership with Belfast City Council, on the BCC grassland site at Sharman Road
- 2 bramble clearance tasks on the species-rich grassland banks of the Giant's Ring, in liaison with HED (Historic Environment Division)
- 1 young oak aftercare task in Belvoir ASSI, under agreement with Forest Service and NIEA
- 2 oak 'haloing' tasks in Belvoir ASSI, under agreement with Forest Service and NIEA

Grassland Management – Sharman Road

To improve the biodiversity value of the semi-natural grassland at Sharman Road, the LVRP Conservation Volunteer teams have been carrying out meadow management tasks over the autumn, with a further two tasks on site in November, cutting and lifting the grassland with traditional scythes to reduce nutrient input, alongside digging out the more competitive rank species such as docks and thistles, before raking and removing to a green skip provided by Belfast City Council. Thanks for all your hard work folks!

Bramble Clearance - Giant's Ring

Six more builder bags of brambles were removed from the Giant's Ring banks, on two tasks in November/December. Alongside being important for grassland habitat conservation, the volunteer work on site will also help to conserve the archaeology of this State Care Monument, which is in the care of the Department for Communities Historic Environment Division (HED). Brilliant job folks!

Belvoir ASSI (Area of Special Scientific Interest) – Oak Haloing

As part of the habitat management plans for Belvoir ASSI (drawn up by LVRP in partnership with NIEA and under license from the Forest Service), scrub removal from around the ancient and veteran oaks is being carried out in a process known as 'oak haloing'. Two more haloing tasks were carried out in December, with the volunteers removing smaller trees and scrub with hand tools, and also assisting in the cutting up of larger fells carried out by LVRP staff with chainsaws. Thanks folks – fantastic work!
